**St. Anthony's Bread**

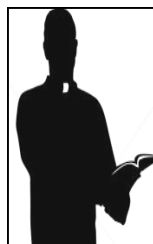
In September 2009, SAB wrote checks for six commitments and 61 requests for assistance. We paid partial rent, energy, or water bills for 53 households. Many of these were in danger of becoming homeless, or utility shut off, if their bills were not paid. We helped buy a bus ticket for a person who had to leave town for safety. We paid a portion of car repair for three working people; helped an individual acquire a birth certificate for employment; and paid for a month's storage for a homeless family so they would not lose all of their possessions. There were 113 children in the families assisted in September. Fourteen recipients had reduced hours or were unemployed; seventeen were disabled or ill; twenty-three were single parents.
