St. Anthony's Bread

April 2010

We are so grateful for your support. SAB assisted 59 households with partial payment of rent or utilities in April. Most of these were at risk of homelessness or utility disconnect if the bills remained unpaid. SAB paid for one month's storage for two women and one family while all obtained secure housing; helped three families with car repair bills; assisted a refugee family with household goods; and paid a portion toward medication and a phone plan.

In the families helped in April, there were 143 children; 29 single parents; and two who were caring for extended family. The individuals we helped included 20 who are disabled or ill; 16 had financial problems due to reduction in hours or unemployment.

Each year, the Annual Diocesan Appeal raises financial support for the day-to-day operations of our diocese. It has been 20 years since the Diocese of Davenport has conducted a capital campaign over and above the ADA.
